# THE NEXT WAVE 2017 – Introspection

The Next Wave is NUS Dance Ensemble's (NUS DE) annual production, a long-running series that has spanned over 20 years since 1995. Under the artistic direction of NUS DE's Resident Choreographer, Zaini Mohd Tahir, The Next Wave aims to showcase thought-provoking and unconventional full-length pieces. Over the years, NUS DE has worked with numerous notable choreographers, such as Jeffrey Tan (founder and Artistic Director of Jeffrey Dance Academy), Albert Tiong (lecturer at LASALLE College of the Arts), Low Mei Yoke (co-founder and Artistic Director of Frontier Danceland), Alden Lugnasin (Resident Choreographer of Ballet Philippines) and Kavitha Krishnan (founder of Maya Dance Theatre). The unique choreographic works by these established choreographers have enriched NUS DE's repertoire immensely.

In line with celebrating NUS DE's 25th anniversary, The Next Wave 2017 – Introspection reflects on the current state of dance 25 years after the Ensemble's inception. The show brings to awareness the art form's evolving landscape, where an urban dimension is emerging on top of the traditional, calling for the need to reposition and realign oneself with the changing environment. It responds to this scene by exploring the abstract question of balance – is change a fluid state of flux or are tensions necessary?

The Ensemble's response to the above is manifested through four different works, each showcasing a different facade of confrontation towards the urban, fast-paced lifestyle of the present. This production features the works of four established choreographers – NUS DE alumni Shahbirul Zaki Ahmad and Mirabel Jiang, Principal Dancer/Choreographer of Aswara Dance Company Fairul Zahid, and Zaini Mohd Tahir, NUS DE's Artistic Director.

## NUS DANCE ENSEMBLE 25<sup>TH</sup> ANNIVERSARY

NUS Dance Ensemble (NUS DE) celebrates its 25th anniversary this year with 3 exciting line-ups.

NUS DE kicked off the celebratory showcase at NUS Arts Festival 2017's opening show with Remember When... embracing the theme "Brave New Worlds". It explored how changes in Singapore's landscape over time affects citizens' psyches in terms of their memories and their sense of belonging. It featured research-based works by both NUS DE resident choreographer, Zaini Mohd Tahir, as well as Kow Xiao Jun, whose background in landscape architecture lent a unique and perhaps more technical perspective on how space can affect one's psychological state.

Following NUS Arts Festival was Evocation, NUS DE's other annual production which serves as a platform for young choreographers to produce creative works. This production provided exposure not only to the younger choreographers but also to the dancers who had only just joined NUS DE, many of whom danced with the Ensemble for the very first time. In light of the Ensemble's 25th anniversary, Evocation, which is typically a smaller-scale and intimate production, featured collaborations with Republic Polytechnic (RP) and ITE College Central. This production was NUS DE's first outdoor public stage performance at Esplanade Outdoor Theatre – a great outreach opportunity to profile NUS DE and younger dance groups, and present their works to a wider public audience.

Concluding the season is this much-anticipated *The Next* Wave. Following the huge success of NUS DE's last international collaboration with Philippines's De La Salle University – College of Saint Benilde in 2012, the audience will be treated to another international collaboration this year with overseas choreographer Fairul Zahid, all in support of NUS DE's 25th anniversary.



### NUS DANCE ENSEMBLE

NUS Dance Ensemble (NUS DE), a member of NUS Centre For the Arts, was founded in 1992 by Resident Choreographer and Artistic Director, Zaini Mohd Tahir. As a group, NUS DE comprises of mostly NUS undergraduates, together with a strong base of extremely dedicated alumni who remain active through participating in performances and productions. NUS DE has a unique style of Asian Contemporary dance that is rooted in Asian tradition and also seamlessly incorporates western jazz, ballet and contemporary techniques. Through its dynamic style and modern interpretations of ethnic elements, NUS DE has earned wide recognition for its unconventional repertoire.

Under the direction of Zaini Mohd Tahir, and the management of NUS Centre For the Arts, NUS DE staged its first dance concert, Imageries, at Kallang Theatre in 1992. Since then, it has been active at external events such as Republic Polytechnic's Momentum, the National Arts Council's Got To Move and ITE's Emblazon. NUS DE also regularly performs for various NUS events such as HERE! and the Student Life Fair. Besides these various engagements, NUS DE also stages two major productions a year – namely Evocation and The Next Wave, and has a total annual audience of at least 3,000 including students, adults, dancers and corporate companies.

Inaugurated in 1996, The Next Wave concert first served as a platform to discover and groom new choreographers and talents in dance and to foster a sense of camaraderie with its active alumni members. In addition, dancers are given the opportunity to work with notable external choreographers, not only expanding their dance vocabulary, but also enriching the NUS DE's portfolio as a dynamic and versatile company. This encourages the development of innovative choreography that fuses modern technique and ethnic spirit, defying conventional boundaries and simple categorization.

NUS DE has earned wide recognition for its dedication in showcasing new talents and original works. Today, NUS DE has established itself remarkably, with past performances receiving acclaim for having 'a compelling hybrid of styles, watermarked with an upbeat pulse which is a trademark of NUS Dance Ensemble', and being 'a pleasure... to watch'. Its dancers, in turn, have been lauded as 'a confident, energietic lot', whose 'polished dancing reaches, plunges into the moment', as quoted from Flying Inkpot Theatre Reviews. Such recognition has spurred the group to strive harder for greater achievements.

NUS DE has not only established itself locally but has also expanded its reach to neighbouring Asian regions. This includes performances in Malaysia, Jakarta, Thailand, Jogjakarta (for the 2005 ASEAN Cultural Youth Forum), NUS DE also represented Singapore at the China-ASEAN Youth Arts Festival in Guizhou in 2008. At the New Prague Dance Festival held in Prague in 2009, NUS DE bagged the awards of Best Choreography and Special Personal Award of the Director amongst some 400 over reputable contestants worldwide. In 2012, in collaboration with De La Salle University-College of San Benilde, NUS DE presented its works at ObservAsian in Manila, Philippines. In July last year, NUS DE also participated in the International Youth Dance Festival 2016 in Macau. Ultimately, NUS DE aims to be a platform for collaborative work between companies and institutions, in South East Asia:

A well-known and accomplished choreographer, Shahbirul Zaki Ahmad is afamiliar face in the Singapore dance scene. He first started dancing during his undergraduate days and was one of the pioneer members of the NUS Dance Ensemble (NUS DE). Since then, Zaki has actively choreographed for NUS DE's numerous performances. Over the years, Zaki has also choreographed for many



large-scale performances, including the movie Forever Fever, Singapore Idol and MediaCorp's New Year countdown celebrations. He is also currently a dance instructor and resident choreographer at the following schools: Meridian Junior College, Temasek Junior College, Saint Andrew's Junior College, Anglo-Chinese Junior College, CHIJ Katong Convent and CHIJ Secondary (Toa Payoh). The schools he has worked with have established themselves considerably in various renowned competitions, such as the 2011 Italian Dance Grand Prix, where CHIJ Toa Payoh won 1st prize for the ethnic, choreography and overall performance categories.

## ZAINI MOHD TAHIR

As the founder and Artistic Director of NUS Dance Ensemble since 1992, Zaini has led the company to great acclaim, evident from their annual concerts, The Next Wave (1995 - 2017) and Evocation (2002 - 2017), as well as NUS CFA's Dance Reflections (1995 - 2015). To date, he has choreographed over 100 works for the company. He has also led the company to numerous overseas performances including the ASEAN University Cultural Forum (Jogiakarta, 2005 and Phnom Penh, 2007), china-ASEAN Youth Arts Festival (Guizhou, 2008), Hong Kong Teens Dance Festival (2011), ObservAsian (Manila, 2012) a collaborative project with De La Salle University – College of Saint Benilde and the recent Macau Youth Dance Festival (2016). Trained in ballet, jazz and contemporary dance, his choreographic style is deeply rooted in traditional Asian movement, bearing testimony to his Indonesian classical training at the Bagong Academy of Dance in Jogiakarta.

His other choreographic works include Whole New World (Singapore Airlines, 1998), Reach (Singapore Airlines, 1998), Hearts over Heels (Singapore Airlines, 2001), Aladdin (Wild Rice, 2004), Fight Fever (Singapore Airlines, 2001), Aladdin (Wild Rice, 2004), Fight Fever (Singapore Airlines, 2004), Army Daze (Henderson Secondary School, 2004), Macbeth (NUS CFA, 2005), Broadway Christmas Carol (The Arts House, 2005), CABARET (Toy Factory, 2006), Singapore Day in New York (2007), Esplanade's Magic Box (2008), Sleepless Town (Toy Factory, 2009), National Broadway Company (Esplanade, 2012), Samarpaana Classical Dance Festival (Bangalore and Singapore, 2013), ChildAid Concert (SPH, 2012 - 2015), Sing50 Concert (2015), and Asian superstar Feixing's music video and concert tour (2007 - 2015). He also directed Singapore's entry for the MIDEM Music Festival (Cannes, 2012) featuring Singapore's best musicians such as Wicked Aura, The Professionals and Tay Kewei, and was the artistic director for ITE's dance concert, Emblazon (2013 - 2017). He was also the Chief Choreographer of the National Day Parade in 2014 and 2015.

His latest projects cross-border projects include choreographing Osman Ali's latest musical film, 'Sinaran' with Malaysian star Lisa Surihani and Shelia Majid and being the Singapore judge for India's Zee TV's reality dance show, Dance Singapore Dance Season 1. He has also been invited to be in the panel of adjudicators for numerous dance competitions including The Royal Dance Off (O School, 2011 - 2017), Super 24 (O School, 2017) and the Singapore Youth Festival Presentation (Ministry of Education, 2013 - 2017).

At the New Prague Dance Festival held in July 2009, he received two accolades – the Best Choreographer Award and a Special Award by the Festival Director and in 2010, he was presented the Commendation Medal at the National Day Awards for his contribution to youths through the arts.
